



<u>CHANGES TO VOTIVE</u> <u>PRAYER CANDLES IN</u> <u>CHURCH</u>



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"When evening came" (Mt 20:8), the owner asked his manager to call the workers from the fields and give them their wages. This week's Scriptures invite us to ponder on our 'final days / evening of life'...closing moment of our earthly journey or the final steps of our pilgrimage of faith. We will be called by our name (Ex 32:32) as all our names are written in the book of life / in the palm of His hands. The Book of Genesis reminds us that 'we are created in His image and likeness' (Ge 1:27) and we have become the apple of His eyes. Therefore, Paul encourages us to live a life worthy of our calling..."If I live, I live for the Lord, if I die, I die for the Lord. Whether I live or die, I am the Lord's." (Rm 14:21)

The good Lord will reward each of us according to our love and commitment to Him and to our loved ones. The Evangelist Mathew in 25:31 reminds us about the last judgement and elicits a few questions thoughtfully... 1) Did we manifest our fairness and justice to everyone?

2) Did we love and care for all God's creation / Did we deny justice and fairness to people depending on our whims and fancies?

Jesus would be able to decide our worth (Mt 25:40) with the following phrase, "Whatever you have done to the least of these brothers and sisters, you have done it to me. Enter into my Kingdom & Fellowship". Therefore, we are encouraged to follow the commission of God to enter into His Presence and to Participate in His Eternal Banquet. (Is 25:6)

The Evangelist Mathew also uses the expression, 'Early in the Morning' the landowner went out to look for workers. (Mt 20:1) 'Early in the Morning' refers to the 'Spring Time' experience in faith... especially when we made a decision to follow the Lord. Prophet Jeremiah (20:7) used the expression: "You have enticed me & I was enticed by you"...as a young person enticing his or her future partner. Early in the morning is that specific time that we took the decisive decision to embrace God & Faith. That particular time that we took a pledge and promised to live and share God's justice and fairness with everyone.

St. John of the Cross (1542-1591) says that 'at the evening of life', we would be judged by the Almighty God. According to him, it is a great wisdom for all to know, 'how to be silent before the Lord', as Christ stood before Pilate. (Mt 27:11-14). Since God is the Judge, He will judge us fairly!

Pope Leo XIII in his 'Social Teachings of the Church on Capital & Labour', spoke on the concept of 'Just Wage', which became a thought-provoking encyclical letter with the name "Rerum Novarum". He insisted on the concept of 'Just Wage' which is the legitimate right of every individual. It's a 'Natural Right' which should be sufficient for the family. Pope John Paul II quoted this phrase oftentimes in his addresses and was pleading for 'a living wage' that is based on 'Justice and Fairness'.

The hiring practice in the world of Labour Market would be through 'application, education, selection, merit along with signing of contracts, etc.; whereas in God's Kingdom, the invitation to live a life of grace is a free gift for all. He extends this gift to all. God only encourages but never fires anyone from His love. There's no punishment from the Divine, but always forgiving and embracing with mercy and compassion. "Would you like to be a Steward in God's Kingdom?" 1Cor 4:2 Reminds, "Stewards are to be found trustworthy"....and if we could live this commitment, our 'evening of life' will be pleasant in His Paradise.

AN UPDATE FROM THE SUMMERLAND REFUGEES SUPPORT GROUP September 2023

Dear Members and Supporters of the Summerland Refugees Support Group,

As many of you are aware, the last family that the SRSG group supported, moved to Penticton this past January as there was no appropriate housing available for them to rent here in Summerland.

The Ayuen Mach family made a successful transition to Penticton! Abuk and Herjok finished off their school year at Columbia, and Yar and Mach at PenHi. Amier and Angeth, the two young adults, and their mother, Ajah, found work in Penticton while continuing to take English language classes. The youngest member of the family, Alier, continues to keep mom busy and will start Kindergarten in 2024.

The family is doing well and is very appreciative of the support that they received throughout their first year in Canada. The SRSG is no longer obligated under the federal sponsorship agreement to provide financial support, although many SRSG members have chosen to remain involved. Navigating government paperwork, providing driving lessons, and arranging transportation are just a few of the supports that continue to be offered to the family.

As this family continues to move towards being fully independent, their biggest need at this time is a vehicle. Thanks to the generosity of a local couple who have been using their own vehicle for private lessons, four members of the family have achieved their driving learners permit! Practicing their driving skills using a vehicle they will eventually use for their driving test in the fall would be very beneficial, as would owning and insuring their own vehicle. Having a vehicle would help with the children attending three different schools plus college, mom in English lessons, four part-time jobs, and grocery shopping for a family of eight!

The family is looking for a small, gas efficient, automatic car in good shape. If any of our members know of, or have, a reliable vehicle that they would like to donate or sell at a reasonable price to the family, it would be greatly appreciated.

A monetary donation can also be made to the SRSG to be used towards the purchase of a vehicle.
