
#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Jesus advised, "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 13:35). Christ's love is our Christian role model for our Charity, which is 'Fraternal Love / Charity', is the sign of the Universal Church. On the last night when Jesus and his disciples were together, Jesus said, "I give you a New Commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you. You should love one another". Jesus' mandate is 'to express our love in action' (Gal 5:8). St. John who leaned on the chest of Christ on the last supper reminds (1Jn3:18) "Let not our love just be in words and speeches. But let it be expressed in deeds". Jesus expressed his love in action through the foot washing ceremony. He also demonstrated his deep and abiding love through his humble gesture of stooping down to touch the dirty feet of his disciples. Pope Francis reminds us that we need to move out of our comfort zone to connect with our brothers and sisters who live in squalid conditions. In his Encyclical Letter 'Joy of the Gospel' the Pope wrote, "Go to the periphery of your area/parish and connect with your people in Christ's service". (This is the Pastoral Leadership Mandate for the Church and its people.)

Paul and Barnabas were able to follow this Pastoral Leadership in the early church, reports the Book of Acts (14:21-27). God's Word was able to spread by their timely commitment to this stupendous mandate of Christ. They were the early missionaries who planted the Church in our modern world. The Letter of Paul to the Corinthians 3:1-4 explains this mission of the church succinctly: "I treated you as people of flesh, still infants in Christ". What I fed you with was milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it, and indeed, you are still not ready for it, since you are unspiritual. Paul and Barnabas established Churches in Derbe, Pisidia, Phrygia, Samaria, Phoenicia, Pamphylia and Antioch. In fact, they, who were to open the door of Faith to the Gentile People to embrace Christian Faith through their commitment and hard work for the Lord Jesus! We wonder at the spirit and enthusiasm of Paul and Barnabas in establishing the Early Christian Churches and their administrative structures, (Appointment of Church Elders = Bishops, as Leaders of the Local Churches, which are relevant even today, who govern and regulate public worship and establish of New Communities in their given territories).

'God Creates and Recreates' the redeemed community. The Book of Revelation 21:1-5 tells us about 'Creation and New Creation'. Our Christian Community is constantly recreated through the Celebration of the Mysteries of Christ especially during the time of the Easter Season. We had just celebrated the Suffering, Death and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus! The redeemed community of faith is renewed and rejuvenated through these festivities. We have become the City of God (Heb 11:10), like the early Israelites, who lived in the Tents while they looked forward to the City designed, founded and built by God". God is the Cap Stone / Foundation Stone (1 Pt 2:4-6) "He is the Living Stone, rejected by men but Chosen by God and precious to Him"...who calls us to be living stones to beautify this edifice of His Spiritual House". It's God who lays our foundation in faith. Jesus' values of Love and Brotherhood is our Foundation. We build this Temple of God / The Holy City, called the Church, through our sisterhood and brotherhood. We share and care for our fellow Christian members through our love and charity and become a New Creation in Christ (2 Cor 5:17). May the good Lord Jesus bless our love and commitment not only now but until the final days of our life.

#### CCCB Welcomes Pope Leo XIV with Rejoicing and Prayers

8 May 2025, Ottawa – Today, the Church in Canada and throughout the world rejoices, as His Eminence Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, O.S.A., after being duly elected by the College of Cardinals, has accepted to become the 267<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Rome, successor of Saint Peter, and vicar of Christ on earth!

Taking the name Leo XIV, the Roman Pontiff, as the successor of Saint Peter, is the "perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the Bishops and the whole company of the faithful" (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 23). As our loving shepherd and spiritual guide, Pope Leo XIV's ministry is to orient Christ's flock toward the kingdom of heaven, where the citizenship of Christians truly lies (cf. Philippians 3:20-21).

Pope Leo XIV was born in Chicago, Illinois, on 14 September 1955. As a member of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.), in which he held various leadership positions, he dedicated many years of service to the Augustinian missions in Peru as a priest and seminary professor. He was eventually appointed Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, by Pope Francis. As a Bishop of the Church in Peru, he served as Vice President and member of the Permanent Council of the Peruvian Bishops' Conference. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him as Prefect of the Dicastery of Bishops and elevated him to the College of Cardinals. Pope Leo XIV holds a doctorate in canon law from the Pontifical College of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome.

Commenting on this historic moment, the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Most Rev. William T. McGrattan, Bishop of Calgary, asks the faithful to embrace the new Pope: "I encourage the faithful in Canada to unite with their local Ordinary in welcoming Pope Leo XIV as our new Holy Father, and to remember him daily in their prayers so that he may embark on his Petrine ministry with fidelity, confident that the Lord will help him."

As the Church in Canada rejoices today with Christians throughout the world, let us remember our new Holy Father in prayer, that despite the considerable weight of his role and responsibilities, his yoke may be easy and his burden light (cf. Matthew 11:28-20).

May God grant strength and wisdom to our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, and may Mary, Mother of the Church, be ever at his side, guarding him with her mantle of protection.


