

#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

"Community is a Social Capital" and we are encouraged to 'belong to the community not only by our social interaction, dialogue, voluntarism and group networks but also by team spirit and building trust among the members'. Robert Putman, a Sociologist, in his book, "Bowling Alone" discusses this idea of building communities. This social capital is a wonderful investment and members very much benefit from it. Be patient to interact and constantly engage everyone in order to get to know them better and their interests. Knowing leads to a deeper level of friendship and creates a way for developing strong and lasting friendship with integrity and credibility.

"Team spirit will help us to walk the walk". When members feel welcome & comfortable, they begin to cooperate with others to work together for common good. They may branch out into small 'Teams and their Team Spirit' will bring out a lot of good in the community. Once trust is built among members, the community becomes dynamic and vibrant. People are not empty talkers, but everyone is infused with enthusiasm for committed activities, with creativity, innovation people make a real difference by their productive interactions. When people are engaged, community spirit is up. But when it goes down, the community meets with slow death (it disintegrates automatically).

The community is a gift & blessing (it is not a problem or burden). Community is like a family. It should include all members, rich, poor, haves and have nots, literate and illiterate, faith based or atheists. Everyone under the sun belongs to the human community. Despite our differences or variations, we come together as a group and our belonging to each other improves the health of our society. We do not avoid or alienate those who do not share our values, ethics or spirituality. But we learn to respect others and begin to treat everyone in a dignified way. This helps to achieve our common goals and aspirations. Let's remember that we are not 'solo actors' but we are 'a part in the whole'. Let's do things together!

Pope Francis in his 'Joy of the Gospel' (Evangeli Gaudiam) talked about Christian communities. According to him, our Christian communities are models of love. Like Jesus who stooped down to wash the feet of his disciples, we are called to serve our sisters and brothers in our local communities. Let not our commitment be only with our adherence to certain laws and regulations, but we need to raise above these established norms and mingle with people with the mindset of Christ. 'Our Sunday Eucharist expresses our Community Spirit'. We come together to worship the Lord with our partners in faith. We break bread together and participate in our spiritual exercises especially singing together worshipping the Lord!

'Jesus is our cornerstone' of our faith and it is He who leads our Christian communities. Bernard Salt, an Australian Social Editor, had made a study on the several available religious groups 'Who is more likely to cluster in communities?'.... like Buddhists, Hindus, Islamists, Jewish & Christians. In his final analysis he concluded that 73% of the Catholics cluster together because of their "Sunday Eucharist", a model that was formulated in Acts 2:42-47, breaking bread together & listening to the teaching of the Apostles and having fellowship with the participants of the celebration. What a joy it's to belong to this community of faith! Bravo!! Let's commit ourselves to foster and develop this community spirit for ever!!
