WHAT IT MEANS TO FOLLOW

MATTHEW 16:21-27

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Take up your Cross and follow me" (Mt 16:24) is a timely invitation for the followers of Christ. 'Cross' refers to every small & great challenge, shame or suffering, persecution or negative thought and action that we come across in our earthly journey. Following Jesus means 'Receiving our Cross cheerfully and bearing patiently every affliction, shame, evil and enduring them with resignation in imitation of the Lord!'. The Hebrew history tells us that they had challenges of all sorts in the hands of the Egyptians. The Book of Exodus narrates their oppression, suppression and mistreatment by the Egyptians. Their burdens were too many and too heavy. But they endured them by appealing to their God (Yahweh) each time crying out for His help.

How do we handle / manage our challenges / misfortunes like financial loss, broken relationships, painful events like (death or loss of reputation), etc.? These may be challenging and overwhelming.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE continued

Mathew 11: 28-30 invites us to unload all our burdens, misfortunes & challenges to the Lord. "Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, I will give you rest. Take up my yoke upon you and learn from me that I am humble & gentle of heart". Jesus does not promise to eradicate our challenge, suffering and turmoil, but he assists us to encounter them. We need to have the humility of coming to him and asking for his help, guidance and assistance.

Saint Paul in Galatians 6:2 advised that we should come forward to carry each other's burdens. "You should carry forward each other's burdens, and fulfill the law of Christ". We are encouraged by the church to reach out to those in difficult times / situations especially the refugees, the persecuted Christians and the socially discriminated people around the world. Our Christian calling is to lift those who are bowed down by the weight of their burdens (Ps 145) and in our intercessory prayers to remember & are called to lift them up also through our timely charities to bind their wounds.

Untimely burdens come from natural & human made calamities (fire, earth-quake hurricane, mudslides, volcano, mental & physical illness, etc.). Sometimes we get into untold miseries by our own misconduct or others, such as abuse, tragedy, crime, oppression (discrimination) and suppression (curtailing one's freedom). Our own shortcomings & limitations along with our mistakes may generate our lasting burdens and under their weight we become crippled in the course of time due to worry, stress and depression leading to thoughts of suicide.


Charles Dickens in his novel, 'Hard Times' wrote: "Everyday is a Good Friday and I long for Easter Sunday, which never comes into my life". This is the reality of the humans most often. Our spiritual challenges like lack of trust in the goodness of our family & God lead us to estrange ourselves from the love of our families & God Himself. Henry Nouwen in his book, "Creative Ministry" wrote about Nuclear Man. This Nuclear Man has lost faith in the organized religion and believes in the potential self destruction through nuclear technology. Nuclear Man has no values or no value systems. He lives by the hour and creates his life on the spot. Nuclear Man is searching for a new immortality in technology.

Henry Nouwen also speaks about "Electronic Church" a privilege in the modern age of technology.... internet, audio and video materials, DVDs, etc.




